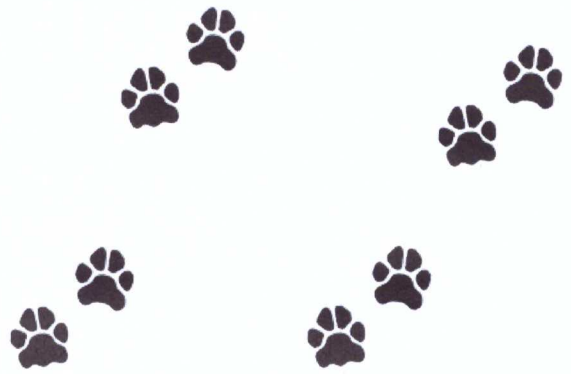


Rescue of animals in need/Serving communities: 2016 – 2017

We are available 24/7 to rescue animals. Inspector Lubbe and trainee Heinrich are always available to help animals in need.



A phone call was received that an animal was stuck in sewerage system in Paarl, our Inspector Lisinda Lubbe and trainee Heinrich Gous went out to rescue the animal. The fire brigade were called out to help and after an hour our staff has rescued the dog which had broken legs and a broken pelvis, and sadly our Vet had to put the animal to sleep.



A phone call was received that an animal was stuck between a clump of weeds. The caller was not sure if the animal was still alive as according to the caller the animal was bitten by a snake. Our Inspector and our trainee went out to rescue the animal. Heinrich had to walk through the river to get to the animal. The animal died on his way to the SPCA.

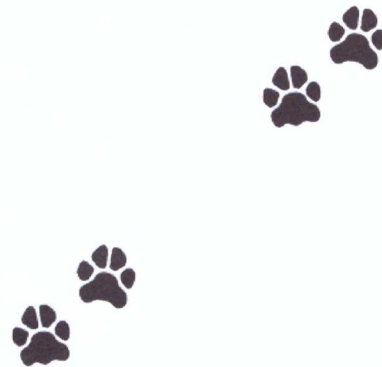

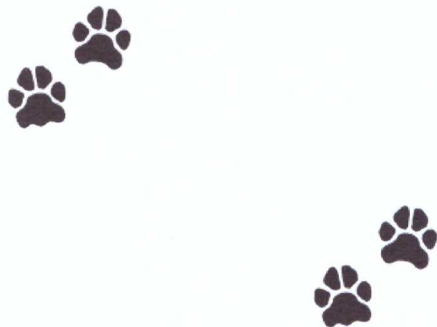


Outreach clinics 2016 – 2017:
